


# **Sausalito Documentary Films**

#### February 10 to March 10, 2017



### Friday, February 10 at 7pm inside the Sausalito Library The Soul of Sausalito (2017, 55 minutes)

The Soul of Sausalito is a new documentary celebrating the uniqueness of Sausalito. The film begins with the Miwok Indians and takes us through a series of invasions -- the Spanish, the Portuguese, the Hippies and, finally, the Tourists. Director/Producer Bruce Paquette will be on hand, along with film editors David Drewry and Saul Rouda.




### Friday, February 17 at 7pm inside the Sausalito Library Rebels with a Cause (2013, 74 minutes)

Rebels with a Cause is about the activists who struggled for more than 20 years to preserve the open spaces that became the Golden Gate National Recreation Area and the Point Reyes National Seashore. Among the lands preserved was a vast tract of the Marin Headlands just west of Sausalito, once slated to become a community of 30,000 people known as "Marincello." Filmmakers Nancy Kelly and Kenji Yamamoto will answer questions after the film.




## Friday, February 24 at 7pm inside the Sausalito Library We Built A Ship (2017, 90 minutes)

We Built A Ship is Stefan Sargent's new documentary about the Matthew Turner, an 1891 replica wooden brigantine that is being built by 150 volunteers and a small full-time crew near the Bay Model in Sausalito. Stefan has filmed every step in the construction of the tall ship, which is scheduled to be launched on April 1, 2017. Stefan Sargent and members of the crew will be on hand for the film.



#### Friday, March 3 at 7pm inside the Sausalito Library Marinship - World's Most Amazing Shipyard (2017, 60 minutes)

Marinship - World's Most Amazing Shipyard is a new documentary created by local filmmaker Eric Torney to mark the 75th anniversary of Sausalito's Marinship shipyard. Built at the onset of WWII, Marinship launched 93 Liberty ships and tankers before the end of the war. The Sausalito Historical Society will host a reception after the screening.



#### Friday, March 10 at 7pm inside the Sausalito Library Tanker (1945, 47 minutes)

Originally a 16mm film, *Tanker* was produced by the Marinship Corporation in 1945 to document Sausalito's WWII shipyard and recognize the thousands of workers who built cargo vessels and tankers for the war effort. The film received its first showing at the Marin Theater on Caledonia Street. We'll be watching a restored digital version. Representatives from the Sausalito Historical Society will be on hand to answer questions after the screening.
